A note from Miss Parr ...

As we prepare for science week, the children across Larch, Spruce and Pine will be participating in a range of scientific activities including; a science carousel, special assemblies and online lessons.

The children will be learning about the water filtration cycle and will have an opportunity to create their own water filtration system using plastic bottles, muddy water, and materials such rice, cotton wool etc. to 'clean' the muddy water.
